

CAMP SAFE Camp Frontier

Camper and Staff safety remains our number one priority at Camp Frontier.

Our *CampSafe Plan* is based upon recommendations from county and state health departments, the *American Camp Association's* Field Guide and the CDC.

OFF-CAMP FIELD TRIPS – So as to protect Camper and Staff from outside contact, there will be no off-camp trips this summer.

NO DAY CAMPERS – Camp Frontier is an OverNight Summer Camp only.

FACILITIES – With the use of 12,000 acres, wide open space, and many large air-conditioned buildings, there is a lot of room at Camp Frontier. Our facilities are outstanding and able to accommodate the needs of Campers and Staff.

SANITATION – Increased hand-washing, frequent cleaning of common areas and many other recommended health protocols will be adopted.

MEAL SERVICE – While it has long been our practice to self-serve buffet meals, this summer, our professional kitchen staff will be plating all meals in the dining hall. There will be two seatings and tables will be sanitized prior each.

SLEEPING SPACE – We are fortunate to have large modern cabins each with a number of bunk rooms on both floors. Each bunk room has two or three bunks sleeping only 4 to 6 Campers per room. Each bunk room has its own air conditioning system and restrooms which will be sanitized throughout the day. Professional cleaning and laundry service is provided during the summer.

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE DAYS

Each family may bring one or two adults to camp for drop-off and pick-up days. All will come directly to the Lakeside Pavilion.

ARRIVAL DAY – Campers and their accompanying adult(s) are required to wear a mask during the check-in process. From the Pavilion, each family will be called to the Infirmary for screening, proceed into the Lodge to complete check-in, then drive to their child's cabin and be assisted with moving in. Campers will then be brought to the HangOut and parents may depart. It will not be possible for parents to visit other camp facilities this summer.

DEPARTURE DAY – Similarly, masks will be worn by parents while on camp. Campers will be checked-out from the Lakeside Pavilion.

COVID-19 TESTING – Camp Frontier will not require testing prior to arrival due to the ineffectiveness of the practice. Upon arrival, as part of the infirmary check-in, all Campers will be given a rapid-test.

MASKS AT CAMP – Campers and Staff will not be required to wear a mask after check-in.

VISITORS DAY – Visitors will not be permitted on Camp during the session. Campers will have TechTime (extended to sixty minutes) each Sunday to contact home in addition to the regular thirty minute TechTime on Wednesday evenings.

HAND WASHING – Between each activity period and prior to meals, Campers will return to their Bunk Room for restroom use and proper handwashing. In addition, hand sanitizer and washing stations will be available at a number of locations around camp.

TEMPERATURE CHECKS – In addition to temperature checks performed upon arrival, temp checks will be a part of each day. Campers with an elevated temperature will go to the infirmary for further evaluation.

CHECKING-UP – As in past summers, parents may text 1-888-CAMP-TXT (1-888-226-7898) at any time to check-up on their Camper. We will reply as quickly as possible.
