Florida's Best Summer Camp Facilities – 12,000 Acres of Fun! All Campers and Staff enjoy, what we believe to be, the best facilities in the south. Located in central Florida, Camp Frontier is in the middle of a pristine nature preserve yet is convenient to major roads, emergency services and theme parks.

Cabins are all air-conditioned and have bunk beds sleeping 12 to 18 Campers and Counselors. Each Cabin, assigned by age group and birth gender, has a furnished common living area, a large table for snacks and games, several bunk rooms each with a restroom and showers for every 4 to 6 Campers.

Outdoor Recreation. There is no shortage of space for outdoor fun: A new horse arena and miles of horse trails, challenge course with a zip line, high, middle and low ropes activities, a swimming pool, a boat dock on a 3,800 acre Lake Pierce for waterskiing, canoeing and fishing, 9 mile Catfish Creek, a games pavilion, archery and marksmanship areas, ga-ga ball pit, softball and soccer fields, volleyball and basketball courts, disc-golf course, tent camping and outdoor life skills area, miles of hiking trails, tall trees with hammocks and picnic tables, many campfire circles, an outdoor programs stage and so much more.

Indoor Spaces are plentiful, all air-conditioned, and include a dining hall, professional kitchen, playhouse with a stage, curtains and lights for performances, award ceremonies and talent show, a dance studio, the camp store, a culinary arts center, an arts and crafts studio, a game room with ping-pong, foosball and pool tables, a fully equipped infirmary with nurse's quarters, offices, laundry facilities, many meet-up rooms and plenty of comfortable spaces to hangout with friends and staff.

Our exceptional C.I.T.s meet through out the day for training in several camp areas such as caring for campers, first-aid, water safety, leadership skills, and activity instruction. When not in training, C.I.T.'s select and participate in all camp activities and assist Counselors as role models.

Adventurers may attend one or two C.I.T. sessions in a single summer but may stay longer if enrolled in another Adventurer Program. C.I.T.'s completing three C.I.T. sessions (over two summers) may graduate from the program and may apply to return as a Counselor Assistant the following summer at no cost for a length of time to be determined by the Camp Director. Space is limited to 8 boy and 8 girl C.I.T.'s each session. The approval of the Camp Director is required for enrollment.

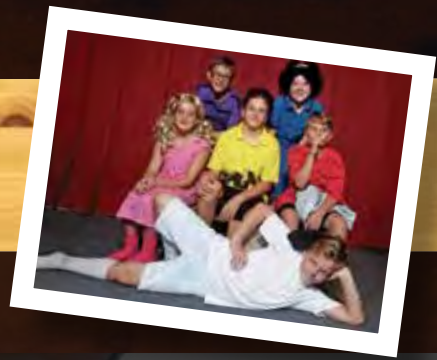

CAP is a complete program for campers who love to cook and want to broaden their skills.

Our outstanding curriculum is customized for the summer camp kitchen and brings a kicked-up menu to Camp Frontier. CAPs will develop skills in a hands-on program intended to encourage their creativity under the instruction of a professional Culinary Arts instructor. CAPs will explore baking and cooking, receive training in sanitation and food safety, proper tool and equipment use, food preparation, nutrition and health, meal planning, introductory dining in a variety of food service settings, units of measurement and conversion, food safety procedures and hygiene, and international cuisine. With friendly competitions judged by Counselors and Campers, all will enjoy the results of this exciting new program. Beginning and advanced skiers alike advance their skills in our WaterSki Summer Camp Program. On our 3,800 acre Lake Pierce, professional waterski instructors provide our campers with personal supervision and quality instruction.

Participating Campers are required to be strong swimmers. As with all our programs and activities, our "safety-first policy" requires that quality water safety equipment is used at all times. Our instructors and lifeguards are certified and our staff to camper ratio is excellent.

All equipment is provided. Those Campers with their own equipment may bring it to Camp. Girls are required to wear one-piece bathing suits and boys are required to wear board shorts."

At the end of the session, each Camper's performance will be recorded and posted online along with many photos from throughout the session.

A number of hours each activity day is dedicated to this program but there is still plenty of time to take part in over other 40 activities. In the evenings, all campers have activities together along with their caring and attentive Counselors.

Each two-week session, all campers and staff enjoy a day at one of Florida's Theme Parks. On the middle weekend of each session all Campers attend either a Bowling Party or BeachBash Cookout. For Teenagers Who Love to Explore The Great Outdoors

This is the ultimate two week experience for teens looking for adventure! More than a walk in the woods, our hikers enjoy the very best of outdoor adventure both on and off the trail. ATe is based at the Nantahala OutDoor Center (NOC), near Bryson City, North Carolina where we utilize a large private cabins and the very best of facilities. Located on the Nantahala River adjoining the Appalachian Trail, the NOC serves as base camp for the entire program.

There are two section hikes on the Appalachian Trail itself lasting four days and three nights for a total of 67 miles. While on the trail, hikers are challenged and constantly rewarded with fantastic views in elevations from 1726 to 5338

feet. This is considered by many to be among the most beautiful part of the Appalachian Trail. Each of the two Section Hikes returns to the NOC where many activities are scheduled such as Duck-boats, Whitewater Rafting, Mountain Ziplines and more. There is time for relaxation and time with friends both on and off the trail.

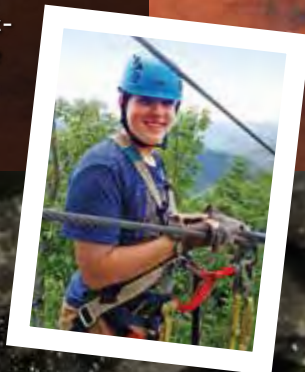

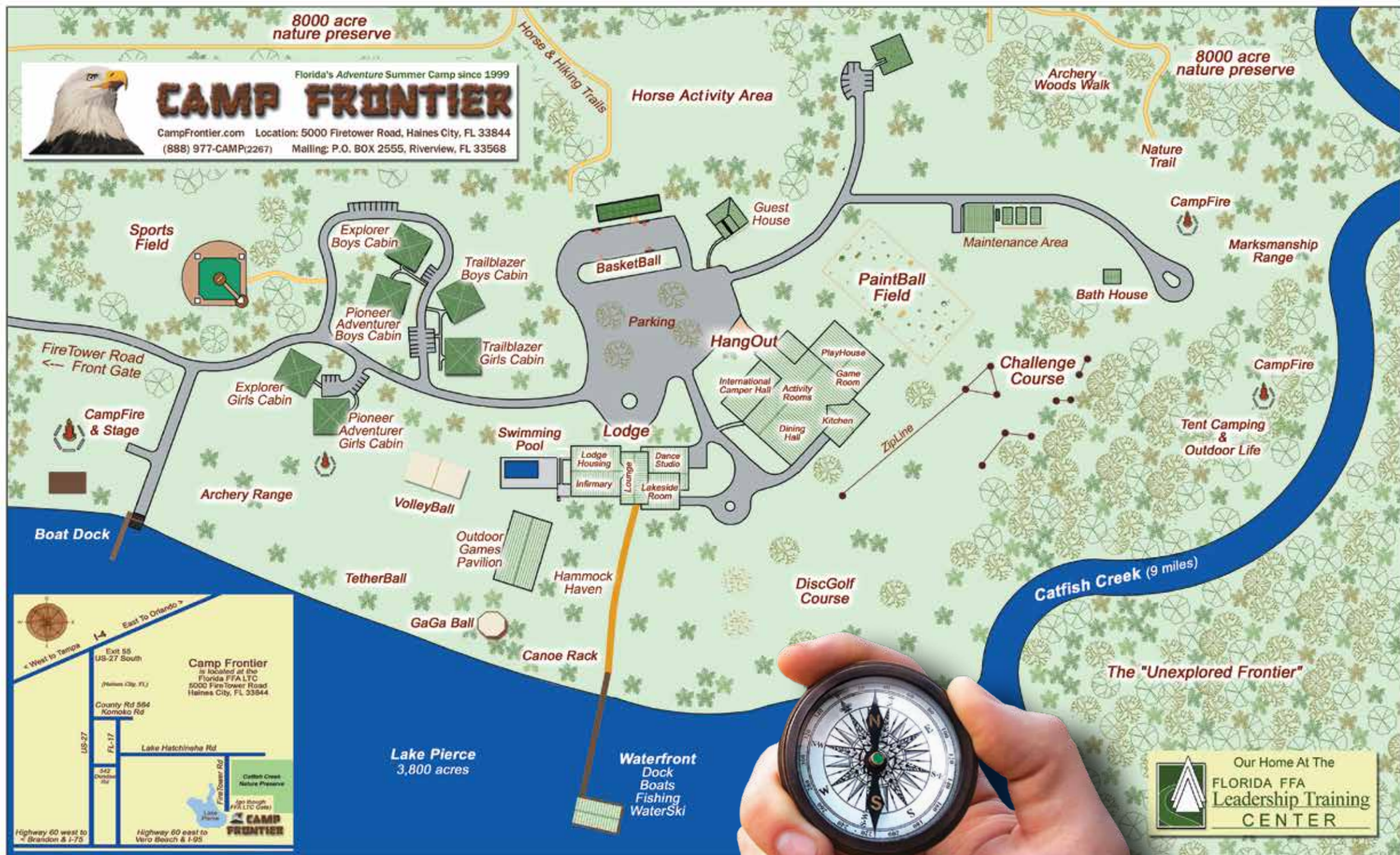
Cell Phones on the Appalachian Trail

The course incorporates a myriad of low ropes course elements that will foster the development of team work, communication and trust. For those seeking a serious challenge we offer our new middle rope course and high rope course elements ending with the zip line.

Campers wear protective headgear and harnesses at all times and are double-clipped to safety cables. Our Challenge Course is professionally inspected and certified.

Paintball Games and Target Range

Campers wear quality protective gear at all times while on the Course. All air, paintballs, guns and safety equipment are provided at no additional cost.



Horse Riding Lessons and Trail Rides



Campers who love horses will find several opportunities to ride and care for the many horses at Camp Frontier. Qualified riding instructors lead lessons in English and Western riding traditions. Through games and lessons, safety and fun are the priority as new riders learn the basics of horsemanship and advanced riders build upon existing skills. All campers have opportunities for lessons and may choose to go on trail rides winding through an 8,000 acre nature preserve.

The swimming pool is open at many times throughout the day for free-swim, water-aerobics, water-volleyball, lessons and more."



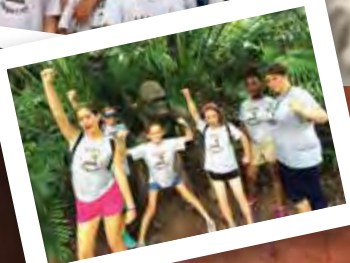

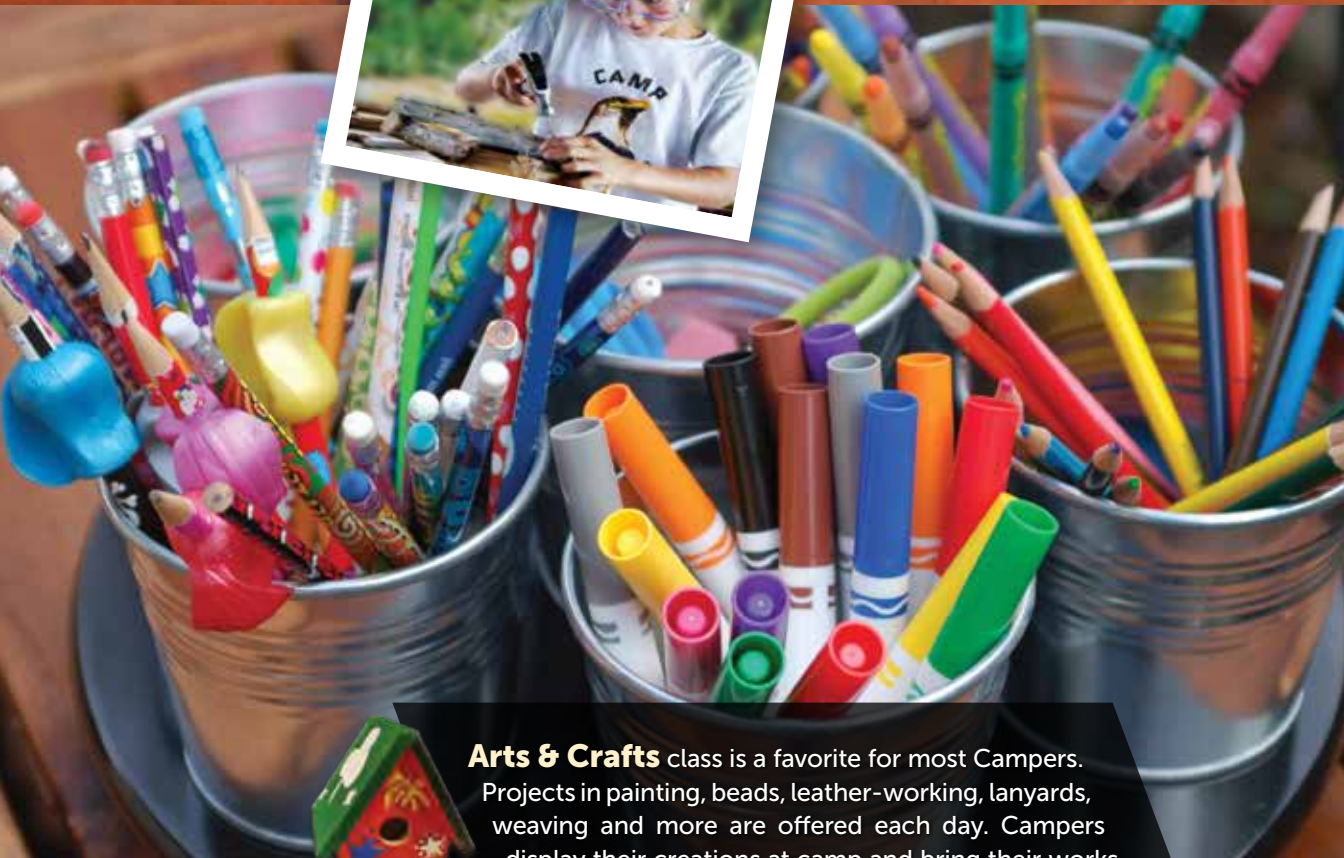
Trips To Florida's Theme Parks

Many of Florida's best Theme Parks are within 60 minutes of Camp Frontier giving our Campers more time in the Park and more sleep when they return to Camp.

During each 3-week session, and certain 1 and 2-week sessions, and all Campers and Staff enjoy a day off-camp at one of Florida's finest theme parks. Some weeks have another off-camp field trip such as bowling or skating. Please see the Date and Tuition Schedule for this summer's field-trip option. Campers choose a ThemePark group based on the type of rides they enjoy. Trailblazer, Explorer and Pioneer groups (ages 7 to 14) are accompanied by counselors. Adventurers enjoy theme parks in small groups with peers. There is NO ADDITIONAL COST for any of the FieldTrips and outings. All transportation, admission and food is included in the tuition of each program. Parents may choose to send additional spending money for souvenirs or the Bowling Alley Arcade.



Crafts, Cooking and Photography



Arts & Crafts class is a favorite for most Campers. Projects in painting, beads, leather-working, lanyards, weaving and more are offered each day. Campers display their creations at camp and bring their works of art home as great souvenirs.

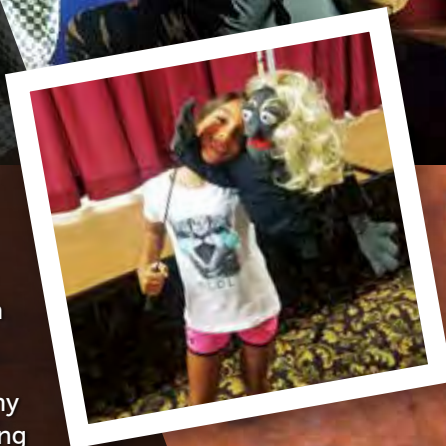


Camper's Got Talent

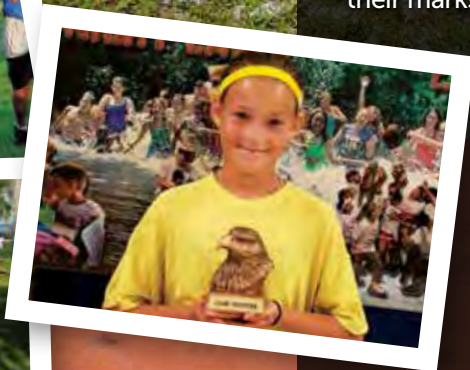

Keeping In Touch

How's My Camper Doing? Keeping in Touch While at Camp Frontier

Camper growth at an OverNight Camp comes, in part, from the independence experienced while being "Away at Summer Camp". Campers of every age, unplugged from electronics, away from regular school friends and the family back home, become a part of a Camp Community making new friends, relying on their Cabin Counselors, and growing in self-confidence. Continuous access to a telephone, email and social media, would prevent the personal growth unique to the OverNight Summer Camp experience and increase homesickness. However, we understand that Parents at home desire to stay informed of their Child's progress at Camp.

We have established the following practices and policies which allow parents to be informed of their child's progress and insure that Campers have the full benefits of the OverNight Summer Camp Experience.

Our Solution: TechTime

Campers Do Not Carry Cell Phones while at Camp, but...

Twice each week for 30 minutes, Wednesday early evening and again on Sunday afternoons, Campers will have their cell phones for TechTime. They are required to call their parents first. All electronics are collected upon arrival and held in safe keeping. Electronics are returned at check out from Camp. Campers without a cell phones will be given access to a phone to call home.



Skype can be made available to our international Campers.

Checking-Up via Text

Prior to arrival at Camp Frontier, parents will receive a text number with which they may contact a member of the Staff at any time. While we never put campers on the phone outside of TechTime, the Staff member will reply as soon as possible the Camper's progress.

Mail and E-mail

Campers love to get letters and packages. E-mail is printed in the late afternoon and distributed each day. Campers are encouraged to write letters and postcards.
